The Best of My Love Kohl's CEO apologizes for firing employee for not backing Christianity The CEO of Kohl's apologized to the company's employee who was fired for publicly disagreeing with the Christian teachings of the retailer and tweeted that he fired the employee in error. "That was the wrong decision and we apologize," David Tovar wrote on Twitter, according to the Washington Post. "The employee was treated with dignity and respect." The board of directors at the Chicago-based company approved Tovar's decision to fire the employee in December, and Tovar apologized for the termination in a letter to all employees on Wednesday. "In this situation, we made a mistake," the statement read, according to the Washington Post. "That was the wrong decision and we apologize. The employee was treated with dignity and respect. The decision was taken by a small group of board members who were not aware of the context. It was not appropriate for them to make this decision, which was not in keeping with our values." The fired employee – identified by the Post as Sarah Clark – received an apology from Tovar and \$10,000 in a settlement, according to the newspaper. In an interview with Fox News on Thursday, Tovar said the company didn't want to get into the issue of religion and employees were simply told not to share their religious beliefs. "We had an employee who created social media posts about his personal religious views," he said. "What the employee posted was inconsistent with our core values." Tovar, who was appointed CEO in October, said he believed his views on religion were non-controversial. "We're a company that celebrates diversity and inclusion," he said. "This individual did not reflect those values." In June, more than 100 employees at the company's store in Las Vegas held a rally in protest of Chief Executive Officer Brian Cornell's leadership and the company's decision to not renew its contract with the National Basketball Association's Philadelphia 76ers, which are owned by devout Christian Chris Paul.
